We use **HAVE TO** and **MUST**to say it's necessary to do
something. Sometimes, it
doesn't matter which one you
use: "It's getting late. I must go
home." or "It's getting late. I.



have to go home."

. MUST is personal. It expresses our personal feelings The speaker thinks it's necessary to do as he says:

"I **must** study harder, because I want to pass the test this time!"

- MUST can be used to talk about the present and the future, not the past: "I must study tomorrow"
- MUSTN'T is used for
   prohibition. It means "it is
  necessary that you do NOT do
  something".

"The meeting is very important. You mestn't be late!"

## have lo

- HAVE TO is impersonal. It is used for FACTS; not for personal feelings. We use it when there is an external rule or situation.

  "You can't park here. You have to park in the blue area".

  "I have to tidy my bedroom or my mother won't let me go out".

  HAVE TO can be used in the present, past and future.
- present, past and future: "I'
  have to send an email": "I had
  to send an email": "I'll have to
  send an email":
   DON:T/DOESN'T HAVE TO
- means "you don't need to do something". There's no obligation: It's totally different from "mustr't"
- 'You don't have to wear a uniform in this school".
